AGC of CT Scholarships Now Available

AGC of Connecticut Scholarships: Two scholarships per year awarded, the Angelo Giardini Scholarship and the Michael J. Timura Scholarship. Each scholarship is a two-year award of \$2,500 per year for enrollment in a College/University civil engineering, construction management, or construction-related degree for a total two-year value of \$5,000.

Young Constructors Council Scholarships: Two scholarships awarded per year for \$2,000 to a student enrolled in a College/University civil engineering, construction management, or construction-related degree.

AGC of Connecticut Foundation Scholarships: Two scholarships awarded per year for \$2,000 to a student enrolled in a College/University civil engineering, construction management, or construction-related degree.

Requirements

Applicants must meet the following requirements:

Be a Connecticut resident; and

Be a person currently enrolled or planning to enroll in an undergraduate four-year building and construction technology or civil engineering program in a Connecticut-based or out-of-state accredited college or university (students entering their undergraduate senior year will not be considered for the two two-year \$5,000 scholarships but are eligible to receive one of the two \$2,000 scholarships); or

Be a graduating high school senior either applying for or currently accepted at and planning to enroll in an undergraduate four-year building and construction technology or civil engineering in a Connecticut-based or out-of-state accredited college or university; or

Be a person currently enrolled in or accepted at and entering a Connecticut or out-of-state two year technical school with a construction course of study, with the intent of entering a four-year accredited undergraduate building and construction technology or civil engineering program in a Connecticut-based or out-of-state college or university upon completion of the technical school program.

Desire a career in construction.

Be a U.S. Citizen or documented permanent resident of the United States (i.e. must possess a "green card").

Applications will be reviewed and winners selected by the members of the AGC of Connecticut Scholarship Award Interview Team which will consider the applicant's interest in construction, grades, extracurricular activities, employment experience, and financial status.

Incomplete applications will not be considered.

The Interview Team will evaluate each on-line application and select a group of semi-finalists. All applicants selected as semi-finalists will be required to interview with representatives of the Interview Team in the spring.

Scholarship checks will be sent to award winners by September 1.

Stanley P. Bitel Memorial Fund

\$10,000

This scholarship was established in 2015 through gifts from family and friends to honor the life of Stanley P. Bitel, the founder of Rowley Spring and Stamping Corporation in Bristol which was founded in 1954. He personified entrepreneurial spirit, continual learning and self achievement all characteristics that should be displayed by the recipient.

Eligibility Requirements:

- Open to residents of the state of Connecticut who are a graduating high school senior, currently enrolled post secondary student or an adult learner seeking qualifying skilled training in the manufacturing trade
- · Past recipients of the scholarship are not eligible to reapply
- Qualifying training includes apprenticeship programs, technical education/trade schools, workforce development programs or pursuit of a four year degree in business or engineering as it relates to a career in manufacturing
- Work history
- Academic achievement, with a minimum of a B average (3.0 on a 4.0 scale)

Letter of Recommendation Requirement: Two letters of recommendation, one of which must be from a teacher and one of which must be from an employer, that demonstrates that the applicant is a "go-getter".

Essay requirement: The manufacturing industry has an abundance of career opportunities including engineering, sales, finance, management, precision machinist, distribution, quality control inspectors, tool & die maker, lean manufacturing, supply chain management, just to name just a few.

Write a one page essay introducing yourself and describing why you wish to pursue a career in the manufacturing field.

Rit Croce Academic and Vocational Scholarship

\$1,000

This scholarship was established in 2014 by the family and friends of Rit Croce to honor his life and his commitment to local students.

Eligibility requirements:

- · Resident of Bristol, Burlington, Plainville, Plymouth, Southington or Wolcott
- Either an adult returning to school or a graduating senior pursuing post secondary education at a vocational school or a two-year or four-year college or university
- Preference will be given primarily to adult learners pursuing a trade or major in education
- Financial need
- Evidence of good moral character and the ability to deal with challenges/obstacles in life

Letter of Recommendation Requirement: Two letters of recommendation, which must be from a coach, teacher, employer, etc. who knows you well.

Essay requirement: Write a brief essay explaining your goals and any special circumstances that you feel demonstrate your need for this scholarship.

Ray Machine Corp./Ray & Darlene Lassy Family Fund

\$2,050

Ray Lassy, a longtime resident of Plymouth, established this scholarship fund in 2017 to assist students who have the same passion he did. Working for over 50 years in a field he loved, Ray started a small tool and die business in the basement of his parents' house while working at a machining manufacturer. He eventually opened his own shop in Terryville before expanding the business to Ray Machine Corporation, also located in Terryville. Ray held several patents for parts he designed and tooled and was passionate about the work he did.

- Eligibility Requirements:
 - Graduating senior from Terryville High School or Thomaston High School
 - Applicants must be pursuing a two-year or 4-year study program or equivalent in precision machining (i.e. CNC operator, machinist, etc.), mechanical engineering, or manufacturing and design at a qualified technical education school, community college, or four-year college or university
 - Must have dealt with challenges/obstacles

Letter of Recommendation Requirement: No letters of recommendation required. Essay Requirement: No essay required.

NESMA Scholarship Fund

\$2,500

In March 2010, the New England Spring and Metalstamping Association established a fund to provide two scholarships that will be awarded annually.

Douglas Roland Aid for the Trades Scholarship Fund

up to \$9,700

This scholarship was established in 2009 by the parents of Douglas Roland to honor his memory. Eligibility requirements:

- Applicants must possess a high school diploma or a GED certificate and be residents of Bristol, Burlington, Plainville, Plymouth, Southington or Wolcott
- Financial need
- Be seeking career training in an occupational program
- Preference given to applicants entering a training program that does not exceed two
 vears

Letter of Recommendation Requirement: One letter of recommendation.

Essay requirement: Write a brief personal statement of how this scholarship will help give you a "step up" to become more self-sustaining and how you will financially contribute to your career training.

Jeffrey Downes Memorial Scholarship Fund for the Trades

Established in 2015, this scholarship fund honors the memory of Jeffrey Downes who passed away in 2015 after a hard fought battle with cancer.

Eligibility Requirements:

- Resident of Bristol, Burlington, Harwinton, Plainville, Plymouth, Southington or Wolcott
- Applicants must be seeking qualified skilled training as a commercial driver or other skilled trade. Qualified training includes apprenticeship programs, technical education trade schools, other career training program with a focus on a skilled trade area (i.e. CDL, electrician, plumber, HVAC, precision machining, automotive technology, welding and metal fabrication, etc.)
- Preference to applicants seeking a commercial driver license (CDL)
- May not be at the top of the class academically but maintain a minimum of a C average
- Preference for applicants that do not qualify for financial assistance from other sources
- Must demonstrate a passion for their chosen profession

Letter of Recommendation Requirement: No letters of recommendation required. Essay Requirements (no more than a paragraph each):

- Describe your passion for your chosen profession and how you plan to use your training to accomplish your career goals.
- What does philanthropy mean to you and how do you plan to "pay it forward" in the future?

Thomas M. Monahan / Philip R. <u>Josolowitz</u> Scholarship Fund Vocational/ Technical or Advanced Training Scholarship Application

INTRODUCTION

The Exchange Club of Bristol is the current administrator of the scholarship named in honor of Thomas M. Monahan and Philip R. Josolowitz, two long time members of the former Kiwanis Club and dedicated citizens of Bristol, Connecticut. One high school senior, a Bristol resident, who is pursuing advanced education at an accredited institution toward the study of technical, vocational, or trade degree or certificate will be selected per year to receive \$1,500.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

A senior attending either Bristol Eastern or Bristol Central High School, St. Paul High School or Bristol Technical Education Center who is also a resident of Bristol, Connecticut.

Recipients of the scholarship must attend an accredited college, vocational / trade school or vocational program leading to trade, technical, industrial or vocational occupations.

INSTRUCTIONS AND DEADLINES

Applicant is responsible for submitting the completed application and required materials to their School Counseling Office or Secretary. Incomplete applications will not be eligible for consideration.

All application materials must be submitted in ONE ENVELOPE: completed application, official transcripts, at least one letter of recommendation (from a teacher, community leader, employer and/or a school official) and student essay. Return the completed application to the School Counseling Office or Secretary.

A panel consisting of members of the Exchange Club of Bristol will review all applications. This panel will select applicants to move onto the interview phase of the application process. Selected students must be available to participate in the interview phase on a date to be determined.

BIOGRAPHY OF THOMAS M. MONAHAN

Thomas M. Monahan, affectionately called "Coach", was born and brought up in Massachusetts. He came to Bristol to work for New Departure. His interest in sports continued as he coached the Bristol West Ends football team and when Bristol High School needed a new football coach in 1917, Tom took over. He eventually became the coach of the baseball and basketball along with football. In the 1920's he took his basketball teams to the National High School Basketball Tournaments getting to the semi-finals in 1928. His fame in basketball did not outshine the successes he had in football with the 1932 team being the only unbeaten team in city history. And in 1933 his baseball team went 19-1. While he was not qualified to teach in the public schools, he was hired as the athletic director at Bristol High School in 1928. As such he counseled hundreds of Bristol youngsters; his office door was always open. In 1937 he became the city probation officer and held that position until 1948. Tom was one of the first employees of the city established playground commission. He won many awards, most prized was the Boy Scout Silver Beaver Award for distinguished service as an adult leader who made an impact on the lives of the community youth, Bristol's Man of the Year and in 1948 he was the recipient of the prestigious Connecticut Sportswriter Alliance Gold Key Award. His contributions to Bristol sports history and service to the community will always be remembered with the naming of the Bristol Kiwanis Club Thomas M. Monahan scholarship.

BIOGRAPHY OF PHILIP R. JOSOLOWITZ

Philip R. Josolowitz, also known as the "Mayor of Forestville" or "Mister Forestville", was born and brought up in Bristol. He attended Bristol schools and graduated from Yale University in 1930. He followed his father into business in Forestville and became a fixture in the community. He was very active in civic affairs being an enthusiastic member of the Yale Club, working for the establishment of a scholarship for new students, serving three terms as president of Beth Israel Synagogue, a dedicated member of the Bristol High School Class of 1925 and a long term member of the Bristol Kiwanis Club. On "Kiwanis Peanut Day" he would be out in the center of Forestville directing traffic and selling bags of Kiwanis peanuts to passing motorists raising funds for Kiwanis projects. He organized the Forestville Businessman's Association and became its first president. After the devastating flood of 1955, Phil worked to relocate the road through Forestville establishing a park along the river bank, now known as Thomas Quinlan Park, dedicated to the honor of the veterans who had served in the world wars. After his death in 1973, scholarships were established in his memory for both the Class of 1925 and the Bristol Kiwanis Club.
